Choosing Faith Worship Series, September 7 - November 16

Choosing faith is something we invite our young people to do at confirmation (which is scheduled for October 5!). But honestly: choosing faith is a life-long project, and our understanding of God and what it means to follow Christ is constantly evolving. In his book, Everything Good about God Is True: Choosing Faith, Bruce Reyes-Chow challenges communities like GPPC to better articulate and more courageously share the beliefs that undergird our living. "Be a theologian," he says: "someone who explores the nature of God in the world and makes claims about what is indeed good about God." This fall, inspired by Reyes-Chow's book, we'll do that. Each Sunday, worship will explore one aspect of the Christian faith, encourage you to reflect on what you currently believe, and invite you to contribute to a visual "montage" of GPPC beliefs. We hope to strengthen our capacity to talk about our faith in a way that feels good and true to who we are.
